Your views on our draft Integrated Risk Management Plan

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service has just published its draft Integrated Risk Management Plan (IRMP) for 2020-2023. The draft IRMP sets out to identify foreseeable changes in community risks for Norfolk that the fire and rescue service has responsibility for and the strategies we intend to use to mitigate these risks.

The Fire and Rescue Service national context is changing and, following the tragedy of Grenfell Tower, has led to a refocus on our statutory community fire protection services. The proposals for development and change in our draft IRMP are focused on improvement, but before any decisions are made we want to hear your views about your service.

Please find a copy of our draft IRMP attached. You can have your say on the plan and our proposals in online consultation at www.norfolk.gov.uk/irmp. Our consultation includes a summary of the draft IRMP and an online feedback form. Using our online feedback form ensures we have a clear record of your response and that your views are accurately recorded.

Online you can also find a list of public drop-in events at our libraries where residents can find out more about both the work of the Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service and the draft IRMP.


